Yes	Matthew 25:32 NASB "All the nations will be gathered before Him; and He will separate them from one another, as the shepherd separates the sheep from the goats;	Jesus is speaking about the judgment day when people will be granted access to heaven or not. This applies to the Christian in the sense that we should know the Good Shepherd and follow His voice.	Judgment
Yes	Mark 4:41 NASB They became very much afraid and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey Him?"	This is an example for the Christian for us to seek out others to help understand the Christian life, especially when it comes to how God works in the world.	Instruction

So for today's Christian, we should make sure that we are focusing on the things that Jesus would have us focus on—loving others and being humble.	Instruction
Yes	Mark 9:50 NASB "Salt is good; but if the salt becomes unsalty, with what will you make it salty <i>again</i> ? Have salt in yourselves, and be at peace with one another ."
